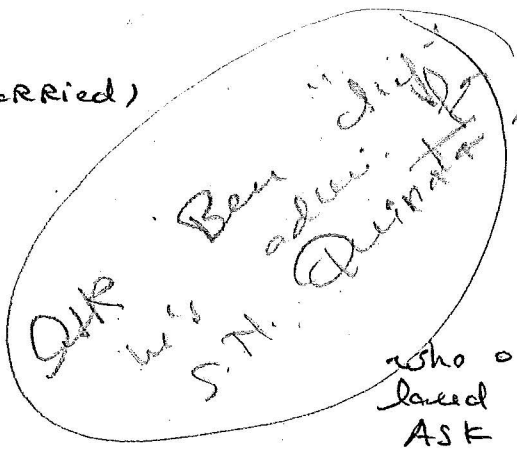

Lots 3, 35 and 39 Q-6 out to govt/ redeemed/ changes occurred  
 Ori. from Serafin Quinata.  
 All three taken in 1940 by the N.Govt. (NPT) from the H.O. of Serafin Quinata. Land was redeemed bet. 1961-1962 for the amount of \$473.08 (L. 35/ 1.50 Ha.) and Lots 3, 39 in 1961 for \$813.75 (1.28 Ha.) by original owner's second sons's son and wife. Now he is deceased so his wife and children hold the rights to the land. Change occurred from traditional pattern. If land not redeemed as a result of govt. intervention, the land would have been in circumstances similar to L. 232-234 (undivided) with lots of people in the siboing group claiming the land. All three lots C.T. so land can be sold. Oldest son built a house in lot 39.

STAYING IN CETTI BAY LAND

J.A.A.

9-15-76

Yes, Boy's family had a house in the village but many of us stayed in Cetti bay for a whole week and went to the village on weekends. Or the Father stayed in the lancho for the week and the wife went to join him in the lancho.

But people had to stay in the lancho because it was a matter of survival. At that time no people working for cash. People depended on their farm products and then they get their cash from selling them in Agana. This lasted even after the war.

CETTI BAY LAND: Lots 8,9,10,11/ EXCAHNGE FOR OTHER THAN Boy  
9-14-76 MONEY/ MAPS/ KNOWLEDGE OF OTHER'S LAND

"I am still fighting to be the Administrator of this land. Land belonged to my F.F. It is way inside between the two rivers. Lot 9 was excahnged by Anastasia (J.T.'s mo.) for a carabao and about \$10.00 my F. gave her. There is a paper saying that when they went to Court to put my F.'s name. And my F. name is there now." "In the old times common for people to trade the land. For example if I have land and no carabao and you 2 have two carabaos I trade land for one to be used as- to carry the plow. People might have figured out it was better to have land and a carabao to work the land that just land. Carabaos were priced much because of their use in working the land."

Boy asked me if I had a map. He said: " I have a very old one. My mo. gave it to my sister and my sister have it. I will go and ask her about it and then show it to you. It has all the names of the landowners in Cetti and in the village. I wanted to have it reproduced but they could not do it in the Navy. It is really big map.

Boy's family had a house in the village. For more on this see card in A-5

When I mentioned about the existence of the map to J. and T. T. said: J. gave it to B. and J. said: Gabriela has it.

CETTI LAND AREA / FARMING/FISHING/  
9-14-76

Boy

People staying in the Cetti area betw. 1936-39. Lots of people staying there about 8 families, Boy said.

Boy said his family stayed there for about 8 months of the year and then moved down to the village. Tha he had to walk to school everyday and be back to th lancho after school.

That they farmed: taro, bananas, tapioca, sweet potatoes, vegetables(cucumbers, green beans and all kinds of diff. plants). That there were three rivers in the area and went to catch shrip and eel at night for the breakfast.

Thatfor going fishing they used torches to see the fist. Torches were made out of:

- 1) nati leaves (best ones of the three) They needed to go to Facti point and get the leaves and make boundles out of them and then carry them to Cetti.
- 2) coconut leaves but did not last as long as the nati.
- 3) carizo

I am not sure if the family (Boy's) lived in Cetti first and then moved to the village or if this was done on seasonal basis. Did they own a house in the village at that time? According to J.A.A. Antonio and Luis farmed in Cetti. So this information coincides.
