When I asked Boy who is the one who takes the pains to register the land he said: "the one who has an interest on it; you have to spend money and you have to go through all the paperwork. In my case my brother and sister were not interested on the land." Now his name is on the land but really the land belongs to the rest of his family. But Boy added:" if you rr name is there you can go ahead and sell the land but really it belongs to the others too. But they often do that.

B. W.W. II the Castillo area was the palce where Boy's F. farmed. But A.W.W.II when the sons got married they needed a place to stay to build their homes. So they moved and started cutting down trees. One bro. and sis. owned the land there /this later sentence do not know if it refers to Boy's F. sis and bro/.

There is a Spanish bridge and then the Fort. The Fort area is G.O.G. land.

I asked Boy how if permission given for a relative to stay in your land. He said: "there is no much you can do about it. Like in my case my sister and brother are staying there."
