Taxes paid

1. Land tax
2. Leases bet. 18-60 to contribute annually 10-15 days on public work or to pay personal tax of \$8 (Mex.).
later abolished &
3. direct tax levied on all leases bet. 16-60 yrs. of age. This abolished after unity in 1909 from \$8 to \$5 (Mex.)
4. In 1912 personal tax reduced from \$3.50 to \$3. ^{addi}
5. 1939 poll tax was \$ a year. Special taxes levied on use of water, domestic liquor, coconut trees for title & ownership of vehicles, dogs & fisheries.

Dimensions of Land Right

Procedural due
Fundsgaard (1974)
(p. 7-8)

1. Area dimension -
sectors, within domain, legends,
2. Time dimension - period during which the right or other relationship has force -
years, lifetime, a period depending on occupation
3. Population dimension - enumerates the persons & groups involved & classifies them in relevant categories, status & social classes - each different category having specific rights -
4. legal & customary dimensions
↳ to which the distribution, transfer, & exercise of rights are conditioned.

✓ Proprietary titleholder = right to use the land in
whatever way he saw fit, could plant,
and could even allow others to do so,
can't sell or trade the land without the
permission of residual titleholder, i.e. Joe

can sell it. [for limited: the one who got
his/her name on paper].
