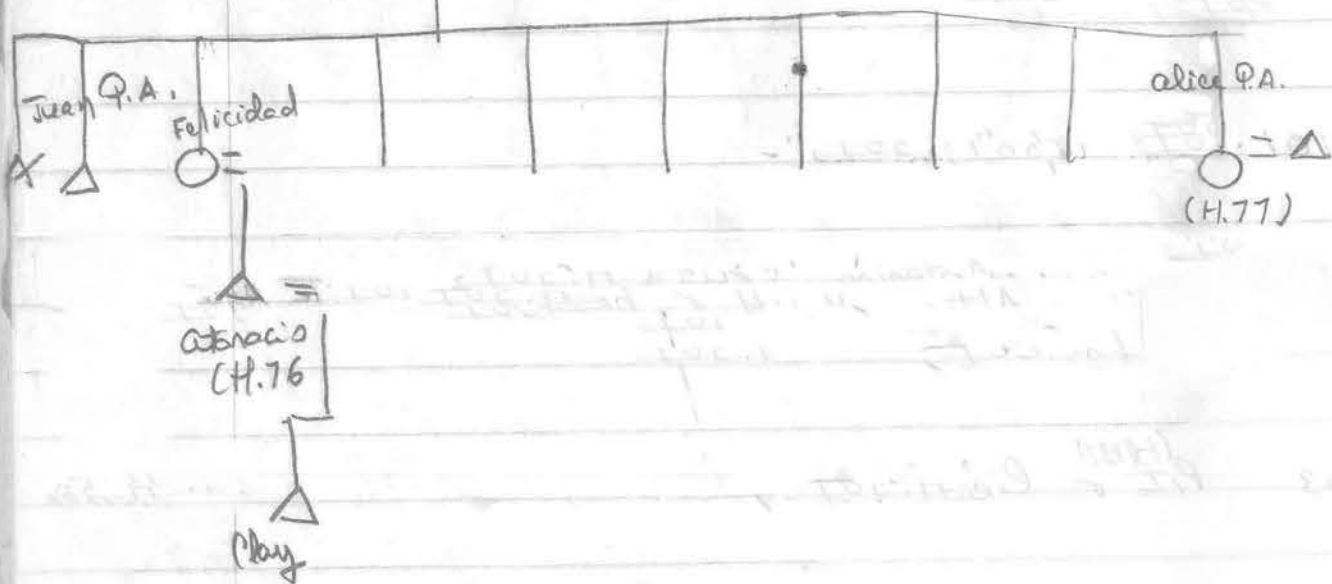

One case explained:

P.C. Joe S. Concepcion died but before he died his brother P.C. the rights to him. Now Joe S. Concepcion's son is claiming the land & all his brothers & sisters are P.C. their rights in his

favor. He is the youngest in the family. I asked if this was the reason. I was told no that it is up to the family to decide. Also if the land is too small; can't be divided as in the case explained.

ADMINIS. When the Court appoints one it's published in the newspaper, village... so all the heirs are made aware of it. If not, it can be contested especially if some members of the family are in disagreement w/ the decision.
